Iowa Agriculture Literacy Foundation Releases Summer PD Schedule

Each summer IALF partners with Local Hosts to offer two-day professional development opportunities for educators. The two-day inperson workshop is FREE to attend and includes on-site tours, hands-on activities, resource materials, lunches and more! These fast-paced professional developments give teachers, extension personnel, and others who educate youth the skills they need to implement many of the Iowa Core science and social studies standards. Using agriculture as a lens to teach provides students real-world connections and relevance to classroom material. Participants will leave the workshop with instructional strategies, lessons, and activities that can be immediately implemented into their classroom with little or no additional effort. Through IALF's partnership through the AEAs license renewal (\$35) and graduate credit (\$130) options are available for the courses.



This year, the IALF was selected as a STEM Scale-Up Program provider by lowa Agriculture Literacy Foundation the Iowa Governor's STEM Advisory Council. Summer workshops occurring from July 15-October 30 will be part of the STEM Scale-Up award program. Registration for all courses will open in late March-early April.

NAITC Classroom Resource Grant Available

The National Agriculture in the Classroom Organization (NAITCO), with funding from USDA-NIFA, is pleased to provide a grant opportunity to provide pre-K to 12th grade general education teachers access to resources and materials to increase the ag literacy efforts within their classrooms.

This year's grant will provide up to \$500 to purchase materials and resources to supplement the ag literacy education efforts within preK-12th grade classrooms. For the purpose of incorporating agriculture into their core content areas, grant funds may be used to purchase resources and materials, including ag-accurate books, from one, or both, of the following sources:

- Classroom Store
- American Farm Bureau Foundation for Agriculture Store

Grant Qualifications:

- State-certified classroom teacher
- PreK-12th grade teacher
- Currently employed by a public or private school

The 2024 NAITCO Classroom Resource Grant applications are now open. The application deadline is April 15, 2024. Applicants will be notified by late April/early May, with final reports due no later than December 31, 2024.
